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Emergency Services Project Completed!

Island Health marked a significant milestone on July 17th with a ribbon cutting commemorating the completion of its Emergency Services Project. The project included major updates to the Emergency Department, creation of a new Main Entrance on 24th Street, a renovated Central Waiting Area, paint and new furnishings throughout and relocation of the helipad from the parking lot to the rooftop.

With the old helipad in our north parking lot, staff would run the length of a football field to transport patients between the helipad and the Emergency Department. The new rooftop pad will not only ensure a safer flight path for our pilots, but timely transportation for our patients when every second counts.

“All hands on deck to save one life.”

During the ribbon cutting ceremony, Dr. Kathy Garde, OB/GYN, (pictured left), shared a touching story highlighting the importance of life flight services. "A number of physicians were on campus for a meeting when we heard about a situation in the OR. We all rushed to assist a new mom-to-be who thought she was coming in for a “normal” birth. It turned out to be much more than that. When we opened her up, we discovered her placenta had attached to her bladder. We had a team of all kinds of doctors working on her and were finally able to stabilize her enough to be life-flighted to a Level III Trauma Medical Center. It was all hands on deck to save one life."

Emergency Department Patient Navigator



With your generous contributions, Island Health Foundation is able to fund a Patient Navigator (Social Worker) for our Emergency Department. Over the last five years, this position has been vital in providing care and planning for some of our most vulnerable patients. The Patient Navigator plays an essential role in crisis management for behavioral health patients, ensuring specialty hospital placement for those experiencing a mental health crisis, and developing care plans and placement for chemically dependent patients. Additionally, they coordinate care for the vulnerable aging patient population and serve as a partner with our EMS, Police Department, and Community Paramedic teams.

In a short five years, our Emergency Department Patient Navigator has assisted 3,369 patients in need.

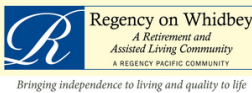
