A Message From Our President

On behalf of the Board of Directors of Island Health Foundation, I want to thank the many individuals and businesses who helped us raise over \$2.9M in 2024. Through the generosity of our donors, we've made a remarkable difference in the health and wellbeing of our community—adding new life-saving and diagnostic technology, sustaining critical health programs in our community and our schools, growing service lines and completing the Emergency Services Project. **Together we have impacted nearly every department at Island Health.**

Excellence in healthcare happens to be a passion of mine. I believe that our most valuable asset is our health; as an individual, a family and as a community. We are incredibly privileged here in Anacortes to have access to Island Health, recognized among the top 8% of hospitals in the nation. There are so many advantages to having our own hospital, including better health outcomes when care is received locally, access to health initiatives specific to our community needs, economic benefits (Island Health is the largest employer in Anacortes), community partnerships and healthcare workforce development. I've surveyed some of our providers on how they avoid professional burn-out, and they tell me it's because they are caring for loved ones, friends and neighbors in their own community. And, I do feel that my Island Health provider truly cares about my health and wellness goals.



Like many hospitals, our small public hospital faces unavoidable financial challenges imposed by government regulatory laws, which are responsible for financial gaps between the cost to run the hospital and the income received from government payers. This reality means that **our hospital is not sustainable without support from our donors.** There is no single silver bullet that addresses these financial challenges. The Foundation, however, is meeting the future head on, with big goals for 2025.

I'm honored to work alongside an **extraordinary and dedicated Board of Directors** (meet our incredible team, including new directors, Dave Harris, Brent Lindquist and Marla Mellies, and new emeritus members Troy Kunz and Bill Rabel in this report). I'm also looking forward to meeting more of our donors in person at this year's *Gala of Hope* on Saturday, April 26th.

Again, we are incredibly grateful to all of you and we hope that you will continue to partner with us as we work together to make the most of the year ahead, to support Island Health and sustain a healthier community.

Excellent Care Inspires a Legacy of Generosity



Remembering the late **Arleta Rae Allen** who once said, "Like any beautiful and growing organism, our hospital needs nurturing and support."

Arleta Rae Allen's commitment to community healthcare inspired her decision in 2004 to name the Island Health Foundation as a beneficiary in her will and trust. This generous bequest came six years before Island Health saved her life in 2010. Reflecting on that time, Arleta shared, "I had a stroke in 2010. I was taken by ambulance to Island Health, got the 'clot blocker' shot, and then was whisked to Swedish by helicopter. That Island Hospital ER doctor saved my life. She remains a marvel in my eyes." She added, "I learned what it is to belong to a small, rural hospital community, where one gets a true feeling about the hospital, the way it runs and its providers."

Arleta's connection to Island Health began in 1994, during her first up-close encounter when a dear friend was hospitalized there. Later, through the numerous hospitalizations of her partner and love, Don Finsen, Arleta's bond with Island Hospital deepened. "We grew to love everyone from the cleaning crew to docs and nurses, and knew most of them by name. In between these experiences, I had my stroke. Island Hospital was there for us all."

Hoping her generosity would inspire others, Arleta also once said, "Get out your pocketbook and write a check, or plan for some other way to feed this vital resource. From birthing through end of life and everything in between, Island Hospital is here for us. Let's keep it that way!"

Arleta's passing marks the loss of a beloved advocate and friend. But, her legacy support and unwavering belief in the importance of accessible, quality healthcare will continue to inspire.

Stewardship Metrics 2024

- Cost to Raise a Dollar (CTRD) measures efficiency. The Foundation spends \$0.11 to raise \$1. This is well below the national average for health organizations of \$0.20 to raise a dollar.
- Return on Investment (ROI) measures effectiveness. For every dollar invested in the Foundation operations, almost \$8 is returned to Island Health.

Island Health Foundation ranks in the **top 20%** of community hospitals and has been recognized by the Association for Healthcare Philanthropy with **High Performer Status.**
